Asbestos Contamination

Asbestos Contamination in Houses built before 1990

- 1. N95 Masks are not sufficient to protect from Asbestos exposure.
- 2. Mold is a significantly lower health risk and priority should be to remove drywall safely rather than quickly.
- 3. Consider all pre-1990 drywall to contain asbestos until proven otherwise. Testing available in Abbotsford.
